CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

NANCY KIME
WESTFALL, OR 97920

confirms the right to use the waters of BULLY CREEK, a tributary of the MALHEUR RIVER for IRRIGATION OF 63.4 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Malheur County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 8, at Page 228. The date of priority is 1881 for Tract 1.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 1½ acre feet per acre in any 30 day period prior to June 1st, 1 acre foot per acre in any 30 day period after June 1st, of each year, or 3 acre feet per acre during any season, diverted at a rate not to exceed ONE-TWENTIETH of a cubic foot per second per acre.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:



This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 6954, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered NOV 21 2016, approving Transfer Application T-11983.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
