CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit S-4453. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: ALTHOUSE CREEK, A TRIBUTARY OF EAST FORK ILLINOIS RIVER

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION OF 20.0 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 0.25 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND

DATE OF PRIORITY: FEBRUARY 20, 1920

The point of diversion extends between the following points:

39 S	8 W	WM	27	SE SE	350 FEET NORTH AND 75 FEET WEST FROM SE CORNER, SECTION 27
39 S	8 W	WM	35	NW NW	1300 FEET SOUTH AND 280 FEET EAST FROM SE CORNER, SECTION 27

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre.

The use hereunder for irrigation shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the original point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion described as follows:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The water user shall maintain and operate fish screening and by-pass device, as appropriate, at the point of diversion consistent with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's operational and maintenance standards.


The water user shall maintain and operate the measuring device as required by the Department.

When required by the Department, the water user shall install, maintain, and operate a headgate to control and regulate the quantity of water diverted. The types and plans of the headgate must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered August 1, 2007 at Special Order Volume 73, Page 18, approving Transfer Application T-8126, and together with Certificate 83396, supercedes Certificate 6113, State record of Water Right Certificates.
