### CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

TIMOTHY DEWSNUP ELIZABETH A DEWSNUP 13683 S MYRTLE RD MYRTLE CREEK OR 97457

confirms the right to use the waters of WEAVER CREEK, TRIBUTARY TO SOUTH MYRTLE CREEK for IRRIGATION OF 3.0 ACRES AND DOMESTIC.

This right was perfected under Permit S-8233. The date of priority is OCTOBER 31, 1927. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.03 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, in any combination, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the points of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent in case of rotation.

# Water use measurement conditions:

- a. The water user shall maintain, in good working order, a totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director at the new point of diversion.
- b. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

# NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The water user shall operate and maintain a fish screen at the new point of diversion consistent with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) operational and maintenance standards. If ODFW determines the screen is not functioning properly, and is unsuccessful in working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may request that OWRD regulate the use of water until OWRD receives notification from ODFW that the fish screen is functioning properly.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered JANUARY 31, 2014, at Special Order Volume 91, Page 789, approving Transfer Application 11474, and together with Certificate 88967, supercedes Certificate 86821, State record of Water Right Certificates.
