 CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to use the waters of JOHN DAY RIVER, a tributary of the COLUMBIA RIVER, for IRRIGATION of 5.9 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Grant County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 15, at Page 461. The date of priority is 1887.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used, and shall not exceed ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre irrigated from APRIL 1 TO SEPTEMBER 30; further limited to 1.0 ACRE-FOOT PER ACRE PER CALENDAR MONTH TO JULY 1; AND 0.75 ACRE-FOOT PER ACRE THEREAFTER; total 5.0 ACRE-FEET PER ACRE FOR THE IRRIGATION SEASON, measured at the point of diversion.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

A description of the place of use is as follows:

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the old point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion.

When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

When required by the Department, the water user or irrigation district shall operate and maintain the headgate and measuring device, as needed. The water user or irrigation district shall report total flow figures when requested by the Watermaster. The Watermaster may operate the headgate and monitor the accuracy of the measuring device, as needed.

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.


Water shall be acquired from the same surface source as the original point of diversion.

The water user shall maintain a fish screen or fish by-pass device.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

This certificate is issued to confirm AN ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered MARCH 26, 2004, at Special Order Volume 59, Page 428, approving Transfer Application 9334, supercedes Certificate 45150, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
