confirms the right to the use of waters as limited and conditioned below. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Baker County. The Powder River decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 6, at Page 291.

SOURCE OF WATER: PINE CREEK, A TRIBUTARY OF POWDER RIVER

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION OF 156.36 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 3.91 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND

DATE OF PRIORITY: APRIL 30, 1863

The point of diversion is located as follows:

8 S	39 E	WM	29	NE SW	2390 FEET NORTH AND 3420 FEET WEST FROM SE CORNER, SECTION 29

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

The quantity of water diverted at the additional point of diversion, together with that diverted at the original point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion described as follows:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The water user shall maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted.


Water shall be acquired from the same surface water source as the original point of diversion.

Notwithstanding that Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife has made a determination that fish screens and/or by-pass devices are not necessary at this time, the water user may be required in the future to install, maintain, and operate fish screening and/or by-pass devices to prevent fish from entering the diversion, and to provide adequate upstream and downstream passage for fish.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in the decree.

This certificate is issued to confirm an ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered October 6, 2004, at Special Order Volume 62, Page 79, approving Transfer Application 9379, as further modified by an order of the Water Resources Director entered February 16, 2005, at Special Order Volume 63, page 234, and together with Certificate 80504, supercedes Certificate 72621, State record of Water Right Certificates.
