## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit S-28815. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the point(s) of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: BEECH CREEK, A TRIBUTARY OF JOHN DAY RIVER

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION OF 16.8 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 0.42 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND

DATE OF PRIORITY: APRIL 25, 1963

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, provided further that the right to the use of water is limited to the period when flow of the John Day River is more than 30 cfs at USGS Gage 14-0465 and more than 20 cfs at USGS Gage 14-0480 and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

# NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the original point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water that was lawfully available at the original point of diversion as described as follows:

### Water use measurement conditions:

- a. The water user must coordinate with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife and the Oregon Department of State Lands for the appropriate permits or construction criteria needed for the operation of the measuring device in the main channel of Beech Creek below the authorized point of diversion to enable measurement of the quantity of Beech Creek water that will enter the John Day River.
- b. The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meters or other suitable measuring devices in good working order at each point of diversion.
- c. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The water user shall maintain and operate a fish screen at the point of diversion consistent with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's operational and maintenance standards.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described and is subject to the existing minimum flow policies established by the Water Policy Review Board.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm changes in POINT OF DIVERSION and PLACE OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered January 14, 2014, at Special Order Volume 91, Page 699, approving Transfer Application 11274, and together with Certificate 89057, supersedes Certificate 87596, State record of Water Right Certificates.
