CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit S-50830. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: AN UNNAMED STREAM AND RESERVOIR CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R-8104, AND MCVAY CREEK, TRIBUTARIES OF PACIFIC OCEAN

PURPOSE or USE: IRRIGATION OF 2.5 ACRES AND SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 42.3 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 0.56 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS); BEING 0.53 CFS FROM MCVAY CREEK FOR SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION AND 0.03 CFS FROM UNNAMED STREAM AND RESERVOIR, SUPPLEMENTED BY USE FROM MCVAY CREEK, FOR IRRIGATION

DATE OF PRIORITY: JULY 20, 1987 FOR USE FROM MCVAY CREEK AND DECEMBER 7, 1987 FOR USE FROM STREAM AND RESERVOIR

The points of diversion are located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year from direct flow and storage, provided further that the right allowed herein shall be limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land and shall not exceed the limitation allowed herein.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484 and ORS 536.075. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 183.484, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied. In addition, under ORS 537.260 any person with an application, permit or water right certificate subsequent in priority may jointly or severally contest the issuance of the certificate within three months after issuance of the certificate.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.


By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described.
