confirms the right to use the waters of the Little Walla Walla River, tributary to the Walla Walla River for IRRIGATION on 5.0 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-3058. The priority date is AUGUST 3, 1916. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially and shall not exceed 0.071 cubic foot per second (cfs) or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:
