CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO:

Gary and Cheryl Ringering 52920 Appleton Rd. Milton-Freewater, OR 97862

confirms the right to use the waters of a WELL, in the Mud Creek Basin, for IRRIGATION and TEMPERATURE CONTROL on 3.8 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit G-13156. The priority date is MAY 3, 1996. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially. The total maximum rate shall not exceed 0.12 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (cfs), not to exceed 0.095 cfs for IRRIGATION, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of appropriation is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent, and shall be further limited to a diversion not to exceed 4.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state official.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

This final order is subject to judicial review by the Court of Appeals under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482(1). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

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C. The Director may require the water user to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the water user to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the water user to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the right. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

If substantial interference with a senior water right occurs due to withdrawal of water from any well listed on this right, then use of water from the well shall be discontinued or reduced and/or the schedule of withdrawal shall be regulated until or unless the Department approves or implements an alternative administrative action to mitigate the interference. The Department encourages junior and senior appropriators to jointly develop plans to mitigate interference.

The well shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works shall be equipped with a usable access port, and may also include an air line and pressure gauge to determine the water level elevation in the well at all times.

The Director may require water level or pump tests every ten years.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with any prior surface or ground water rights.

This certificate describes the water right confirmed by Certificate 86471, State Record of Water Right
Certificates, modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered
MAY - 5 2017, approving a petition by Walla Walla River Irrigation District under ORS
541.329 for mapping water rights within a district. This certificate supersedes Certificate 86471.
