confirms the right to use the waters of the Little Walla River, tributary of the Walla River for SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION on 2.5 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-26001. The priority date is 1/16/1959. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially and shall not exceed 0.05 cubic foot per second (cfs) or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion appropriation is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to 0.0375 (3/80) of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state official.

This certificate describes the water right confirmed by Certificate 86964 (90700), State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered MAY - 5 2017, approving a petition by Walla Walla River Irrigation District under ORS 541.329 for mapping water rights within a district. This certificate, together with Certificate 92601, supersedes Certificate 86964 (90700).

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.
