CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO:

Stadelman Fruit, LLC PO Box 445 Zillah, WA 98953

confirms the right to use the waters of a well, in the Little Walla Walla Basin for SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION on 4.18 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit G-11575. The priority dates are 1/8/1990 for 0.033 cfs and 7/16/1992 for 0.004 cfs. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially and shall not exceed 0.037 cubic foot per second (cfs) or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The point of appropriation is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion not to exceed 4.5 acre-feet per acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state official.

This right is limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

This certificate describes the water right confirmed by Certificate 85730, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered MAY = 5 2017, approving a petition by Walla Walla River Irrigation District under ORS 541.329 for mapping water rights within a district. This certificate, together with Certificate 92671 and 92644, supersedes Certificate 85730.

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The well shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works shall be equipped with a usable access port, and may also include an air line and pressure gauge to determine the water level elevation in the well at all times. When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device and keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

The Director may require water level or pump tests every ten years.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with any prior surface or ground water rights.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.
