confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit S-1216. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the point(s) of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: LITTLE WALLA WALLA RIVER, A TRIBUTARY OF WALLA WALLA RIVER

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION OF 29.0 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 0.36 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND

DATE OF PRIORITY: MARCH 25, 1912

The point of diversion is located as follows:

5 N	35 E	WM	12	SW NE	HUDSON BAY DISTRICT IMPROVEMENT COMPANY POD - 1030 FEET NORTH AND 900 FEET EAST FROM C1/4 CORNER, SECTION 12

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

The Director may require the water user to install a totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device at the location where water is removed from the Hudson Bay Canal and applied to the field. If the Director notifies the water user to install totalizing flow meters or other measuring devices, the water user shall install such devices specified by the Director within the period allowed in the notice. Once installed, the water user shall maintain the meters or measuring devices in good working order and shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices. When required the water user shall install a totalizing flowmeter.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The water user shall operate and maintain an approved fish screen at the new point of diversion. If Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) determines the screen is not functioning properly, and is unsuccessful in working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may request that OWRD regulate the use of water until OWRD receives notification from ODFW that the fish screen is functioning properly.

The water rights confirmed by transfer T-11995 (including this right) shall be subordinate to all other currently existing water rights with a point of diversion located in the Hudson Bay Canal, between the "Frog Structure" and the authorized place of use, in order to address potential injury to current junior users being regulated off in the event the Hudson Bay Canal is at maximum capacity.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the original point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion described as follows:

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered DECEMBER 17, 2015, at Special Order Volume 98, Page 464, approving Transfer Application 11995, and together with Certificate 90699, supersedes Certificate 86961, State record of Water Right Certificates.
