CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

J.B. ELDER
PAISLEY, OREGON 97636

confirms the right to use the waters of CROOKED CREEK a tributary of CHEWAUCAN RIVER for IRRIGATION of 261.0 ACRES, DOMESTIC AND STOCK.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Lake County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 5, at Page 1. The date of priority is 1873.

The amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed A RATE OF DIVERSION OF 1/25 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND PER ACRE, AND THE AGGREGATE QUANTITY SET FORTH BELOW:

3.9 ACRE-FEET PER ACRE DURING EACH IRRIGATION SEASON, BEING THE PERIOD FROM APRIL 1 TO SEPTEMBER 15 OF EACH YEAR.


