The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the well(s). The amount of water used for irrigation under this right, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 3.0 acrefeet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, provided further that although declared herein to be for primary irrigation, the supplemental right perfected under Permit S-49406 may, in the interest of conserving the ground water resources, be exercised at times when water is available from ground water provided that the total quantity diverted from both sources shall not exceed the limitation allowed herein.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity of water diverted at the new points of appropriation shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at

the original point of appropriation described as follows:

The water user shall maintain and operate the existing measurement device and shall make such improvements as may be required by the Department.

Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (water sources) as the original point of appropriation.

The wells shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon.

The works shall include an air line and pressure gauge or an access port for a measuring line, adequate to determine the water level elevation in the well at all times.

The water user shall maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device, and shall keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm changes in POINT OF APPROPRIATION and PLACE OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered JULY 2, 2010, at Special Order Volume 81, Page 337, approving Transfer Application 10437, supersedes Certificate 82486, State record of Water Right Certificates.
