CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

STATE OF OREGON WATER RESOURCES DEPARTMENT

confirms the right to use the waters of SOUTH FORK OF LAKE CREEK, tributary to METOLIUS RIVER, for instream use for conservation, maintenance and enhancement of aquatic and fish life, wildlife, fish and wildlife habitat and other ecological values; recreation; and pollution abatement.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Deschutes County. The date of priority is 1888. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used, and shall not exceed 0.10 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, (IF AVAILABLE AT THE ORIGINAL POINT OF DIVERSION: SE1/4 NE1/4, SECTION 16, T13S, R9E, W.M.; 2320 FEET SOUTH AND 1120 FEET WEST FROM THE NW CORNER, SECTION 16), or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed:

The description of the stream reach in which flows are to be maintained is as follows:

From the location of the point of diversion authorized under Certificate 82275, located approximately at:

13 S	9 E	WM	15	SWNW	1980 FEET SOUTH AND 100 FEET EAST FROM THE NW CORNER OF SECTION 15

To the confluence with the Metolius River.

Water rights upstream of the original point of diversion shall not be subject to regulation for flows in excess of the quantities to which this instream water right is entitled at the original point of diversion.

Within the specified stream reach, the amount of water to which this right is entitled shall not exceed the quantity of water legally available at the original point of diversion. Stream channel losses and gains calculated based on available data and the use of water by senior appropriators will determine the amount of water to which this right is entitled downstream from the original point of diversion within the specified stream reach.

The instream right established by this transfer shall replace a portion of instream water rights established pursuant to ORS 537.341 or 537.346 and shall be in addition to instream water rights established pursuant to ORS 537.348 or 537.470.

The right is subject to all other terms and conditions of Certificate 82275, and any related decree.

This is a final order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

This mitigation water may be used to satisfy a mitigation obligation

within the Metolius Zone of Impact.

Ground Water Mitigation:

MP-192 is used to satisfy a portion of the Mitigation Obligation of Ground Water Permit Application G-17871, any succeeding permit and

any subsequent certificate(s).

The amount of mitigation water generated by this mitigation project is a portion of the total volume transferred instream, being 27.3 AF. The remaining balance of water dedicated to instream use, and not used to satisfy the mitigation obligation of Ground Water Permit Application G-17871, will benefit instream flows.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in use and place of use approved by an order of the Water Resources Director recorded in Special Order Volume 107, Page 141, approving Transfer T-11891, and along with Certificate 93367 supersedes Certificate 82275, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
