### CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit G-11259. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the well(s). The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: A WELL IN THE PUDDING RIVER BASIN

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION OF 24.0 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 0.30 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND

DATE OF PRIORITY: DECEMBER 26, 1990

## The well is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. This right is limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land. The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

A description of the place of use is as follows

The water user shall report a March static water level in the well(s) to the Groundwater/Hydrology Section of the Water Resources Department by April 15 of each year. The measurement shall be made and calculations detailed by a certified water rights examiner, registered professional geologist, certified engineer geologist, professional engineer, licensed land surveyor, licensed water well constructor, licensed pump installer, or the water user.

# NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Use of water from the well(s) shall not be allowed if the well(s) display (A) an average water level decline of 3 or more feet per year for 5 consecutive years, or (B) a water level decline of 15 or more feet in fewer than 5 consecutive years, or (C) a water level decline of 25 or more feet, or (D) a hydraulic interference decline of 25 or more feet in any neighboring well within senior priority which provides water for an authorized use.

The Water Resources Department has determined that the initial water level in the well(s) are those of the initial March report. That is the level from which the cited declines in (A), (B) and (C) above will be referenced.

The well(s) shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works shall be equipped with a usable access port, and may also include an air line and pressure gauge adequate to determine water level elevation in the well at all times. When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device and shall keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of appropriation shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of appropriation described as follows:

Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (water source) as the original point of appropriation.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plans.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with any prior surface or ground water rights.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF APPROPRIATION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered NOVEMBER 17, 2015, at Special Order Volume 98, Page 247, approving Transfer Application 11942, and together with Certificate 90703, supersedes Certificate 89107, State record of Water Right Certificates.
