confirms the right to use the waters of ONE WELL WITHIN THE WHYCHUS CREEK BASIN for IRRIGATION of 4.18 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit G-12942. The date of priority is FEBRUARY 14, 1995. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.053 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The period of allowed use is MARCH 2 THROUGH OCTOBER 31 OF EACH YEAR.

The well is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- a. The water user shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order.
- b. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- c. The Director may require the water user to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the water user to report water use on periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the water user to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under this right. The Director may provide opportunity for the water user to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

The right is limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land.

If substantial interference with a senior water right occurs due to withdrawal of water from any well listed on this right, then use of water shall be discontinued or reduced and/or the schedule of withdrawal shall be regulated until or unless the Department approves or implements an alternative administrative action to mitigate the interference. The Department encourages junior and senior appropriators to jointly develop plans to mitigate interference.

Use of water under authority of this right may be regulated if analysis of data available after the right is issued discloses that the appropriation will measurably reduce the surface water flows necessary to maintain the free flowing character of a scenic waterway in quantities necessary for recreation, fish and wildlife in effect as of the priority date of the right or as those quantities may be subsequently reduced.

The well shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works shall be equipped with a useable access port, and may also include an air line and pressure gauge adequate to determine water level elevation in the wells at all times.

The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.


The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with any prior surface or ground water rights.

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 89686 , State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered JUL 30 2018 , approving Transfer Application T-12510.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
