CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

MORRIS B MCGINNIS, JR
67216 HWY 20 W
BEND, OR 97701

confirms the right to use the waters of a WELL within the WHYCHUS CREEK (*formerly Squaw Creek*) BASIN for the purpose of IRRIGATION OF 4.3 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit G-10463. The date of priority is JUNE 21, 1984. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.035 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The well is located as follows:

15 S	11 E	WM	30	SE SW	726 FEET NORTH AND 625 FEET WEST FROM S¼ CORNER OF SECTION 30

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The right shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:



This certificate is issued to correct a scrivener's error in the number of acres in the certificate recorded at page 93970, State Record of Water Right Certificates, which described that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 65972, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered August 28, 2018, approving Transfer Application T-12615. This certificate supersedes Certificate 93970.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
