CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit S-19151. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the point(s) of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: PINE CREEK AND A RESERVOIR CONSTRUCTED UNDER APPLICATION R-24223, PERMIT R-1001, A TRIBUTARY OF CROOKED RIVER

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION 31.6 ACRES AND SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 20.7 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 1.31 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND

DATE OF PRIORITY: OCTOBER 24, 1949

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated from direct flow, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year from direct flow and storage from a reservoir constructed under Permit R-1001, and shall be still further limited to the use of stored water only on lands described as supplemental.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.


The Director may require the water user to install a totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring devices at each point of diversion. If the Director notifies the water user to install totalizing flow meters or other measuring devices, the water user shall install such devices specified by the Director within the period allowed in the notice. Once installed, the water user shall maintain the meters or measuring devices in good working order and shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices.

When required by the Department, the water user shall install, maintain and operate a headgate to control and regulate the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in PLACE OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered June 30, 2011, at Special Order Volume 84, Page 628, approving Transfer Application T-11209, and together with Certificate 87114, supercedes Certificate 31943, State record of Water Right Certificates.
