CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to use the waters of SEIBEL WELL, in the UMATILLA RIVER BASIN for IRRIGATION of 194.1 ACRES AND SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION of 43.7 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit G-7183. The date of priority is FEBRUARY 25, 1977. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 2.97 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The well is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The well shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon.

Water shall be acquired from the same source as the original point of appropriation, namely the basalt ground water source, and is restricted to the same subarea (A) of the Stage Gulch Critical Ground Water Area.

The use of water for supplemental irrigation is restricted to the total rate and duty described by Certificate 80850, and may be used only to make up a deficiency of supply.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the original point of diversion described as follows:

This certificate is issued to confirm changes in place of use and point of appropriation approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered October 23, 2006, at Special Order Volume 70, Page 387, approving Transfer Application 9853, as corrected by an order entered on December 15, 2006, at Special Order Volume 70, Page 734, and supersedes Certificate 79890, State record of Water Right Certificates.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
