CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

H. C. and L. J. PRITCHARD HALFWAY, OR 97834

confirms the right to use the waters of EAST PINE CREEK for IRRIGATION OF 62.0 ACRES, AND DOMESTIC, AND STOCK USE.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Baker County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 11, at Page 235. The date of priority is 1879 for Tract No. 2, 1885 for Tract No. 3 and 1890 for Tract No. 4.

The amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed ONE-FORTIETH of a cubic foot per second per acre, measured at the point of diversion, and a total limitation of 1.0 acre-foot per acre during July, 1.0 acre-foot per acre during August, and ½ acre-foot per acre during September of each year.
