## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

STATE OF OREGON
WATER RESOURCES DEPARTMENT

confirms the right to use the waters of the LITTLE WALLA WALLA RIVER, tributary of the WALLA WALLA RIVER, for instream use for conservation, maintenance and enhancement of aquatic and fish life, wildlife, fish and wildlife habitat and other ecological values.

This right was confirmed by the Walla Walla River Decree or record at Salem, Oregon in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 12 at Page 9. The dates of priority are 1871, 1886, 1890, 1893, 1901, MARCH 1, 1901, and 1904. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used, and shall not exceed 0.679 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion, from APRIL 1 THROUGH OCTOBER 31, or at such time as water is being diverted for agricultural uses under the originating rights.

The description of the stream reach in which flows are to be maintained is as follows:

From the location of the diversion authorized previously under Certificates 92412, 92440, 92481, 92489, and 92523, located approximately at RM 45.4:

To the Oregon-Washington state line at approximately RM 40.0. The instream right shall allow the use and protection of flows as follows:

Water rights upstream of the original point of diversion shall not be subject to regulation for flows in excess of the quantities to which this instream water right is entitled at the original point of diversion.

Within the described instream reach, stream channel losses and gains calculated based on available data and the use of senior appropriators will determine the amount of water to which this right is entitled downstream from the original point of diversion and within the specified stream reach from the authorized point of diversion at approximately RM 45.4 and whether the described instream flows below the point of diversion may be adjusted. If adjusted, instream flows from immediately below the point of diversion to the Oregon-Washington state line at approximately RM 40.0 may not exceed the quantities specified at the point of diversion.

The instream right established by this conserved water application shall replace a portion of instream water rights established pursuant to ORS 537.341 or 537.346 and shall be in addition to instream water rights established pursuant to ORS 537.348 or 537.470 unless otherwise specified by a subsequent order establishing a new instream water right.

The right is subject to all other terms and conditions of Certificates 92412, 92440, 92481, 92489, 92523, and any related decree.

This certificate is issued to confirm an ALLOCATION OF CONSERVED WATER approved by an order of the Water Resources Director recorded in Special Order Volume 112, Page 135, approving Conserved Water Application CW-27, this Certificate together with Certificates 94145, 94142, 94143, 94140, 94146, 94147, and 94148, and the conserved water under CW-27, supersedes Certificates 92412, 92440, 92481, 92489, and 92523, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
