CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

LESLIE HENNEUSE  
1245 SHANKS CREEK ROAD  
SUNNY VALLEY, OR 97478

confirms the right to use the waters of AN UNNAMED STREAM, tributary to GRAVE CREEK, for DOMESTIC USE FOR ONE FAMILY.

This right was perfected under Permit S-41883. The date of priority is MAY 3, 1977. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.005 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

Twp	Rng	Mer	Sec	Q-Q	Measured Distances
34 S	5 W	WM	16	SW NW	970 FEET NORTH AND 60 FEET EAST FROM THE W¼ CORNER OF SECTION 16

The right shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:



This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 56024, State Record of Water Right Certificates, modified by the provisions of an order of the Oregon Water Resources Commission entered November 21, 2008, and recorded in Special Order Volume 76, Page 751, approving a partial cancellation of a water right. This certificate together with Certificate 85125, supercedes Certificate 56024.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use herein described and is subject to minimum flows established by the Water Resources Commission with an effective date prior to this right.
