CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

STATE OF OREGON
WATER RESOURCES DEPARTMENT

confirms the right to use the waters of EAST FORK HOOD RIVER, tributary to HOOD RIVER, for instream use for conservation, maintenance and enhancement of aquatic and fish life, wildlife, fish and wildlife habitat and other ecological values, and pollution abatement.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Hood River county. The decree is of record at Salem, Oregon in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director, in Volume 17 at Page 333. The date of Priority is NOVEMBER 25, 1895, plus one minute.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed during the specified irrigation season, and shall be further limited to 0.525 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (cfs), not to exceed 125.0 acre-feet during the irrigation season of each year.

The description of the stream reach in which flows are to be maintained is as follows:

From the authorized point of diversion located at approximately river mile 6.4 on the East Fork of Hood River:

To the mouth of the East Fork Hood River, described as where the East Fork and West Fork of Hood River join to form the main stem Hood River. This is further described as Hood River Mile 12.5 in the NWNE of Section 1, Township 1 North, Range 9 East, W.M., at latitude 45.605229, longitude 121.633196.

Within the specified stream reach, the amount of water to which this right is entitled shall not exceed the quantity of water legally available at the original point of diversion. Stream channel losses and gains calculate based on available data and use of water by senior appropriators will determine the amount of water to which this right is entitled downstream from the original point of diversion within the specified stream reach.

This is a final order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.
