CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

WAYNE H. AND BERTHA O. SAFLEY
315 N. PHOENIX ROAD
MEDFORD, OR 97501

confirms the right to use the waters of ROGUE RIVER, a tributary of PACIFIC OCEAN for IRRIGATION OF 5.0 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-4339. The date of priority is DECEMBER 15, 1919. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.065 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

35 S	1 W	WM	29	SE NW	2	2300 FEET SOUTH AND 680 FEET WEST OF THE N1/4 CORNER, SECTION 29

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to a ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:


This is a final order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

This certificate describes that portion of Water Right Certificate 43573, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered JUN 26 2019, approving Transfer Application T-12966.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to the existing minimum flow policies established by the Water Policy Review Board.
