## NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484 and ORS 536.075. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 183.484, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied. In addition, under ORS 537.260 any person with an application, permit or water right certificate subsequent in priority may jointly or severally contest the issuance of the certificate within three months after issuance of the certificate.

The combined quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion (POD 2), together with that diverted at the old point of diversion (POD 1), shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion (POD 1).

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director in good working order at each point of diversion.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the metes or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The water user shall operate and maintain an approved fish screen at the new point of diversion. If Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) determines the screen is not functioning properly, and is unsuccessful with working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may request that Oregon Water Resources Department (OWRD) regulate the use of water until OWRD receives notification from ODFW that the fish screen in functioning properly.

Water shall be acquired from the same surface water sources as the original point of diversion.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described.

This certificate is issued for a partial perfection of Permit S-54829 as described in OAR 690-320-0040 and by an order of the Water Resources Director entered April 25, 2019 at Special Order Volume 112, Pages 1012-1013.
