CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

TIMOTHY AND SUZANNE KREDER
11700 SE AMITY DAYTON HWY
DAYTON, OR 97114

confirms the right to use the waters of AN UNNAMED STREAM AND RESERVOIR
CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R-11247, tributaries of WEST FORK PALMER CREEK, for
IRRIGATION OF 122.5 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-51073. The date of priority is JUNE 6, 1990. The amount of
water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used, and shall not
exceed 1.53 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of
diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

4 S	3 W	WM	31	SW NE	660 FEET SOUTH AND 500 FEET EAST FROM THE NW CORNER OF THE SWNE OF SECTION 31

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing
for the same lands, is limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its
equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet
per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year from direct flow and storage.
The use of water from direct flow is limited to the irrigation season prior to June 1 of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use without waste on the lands or place of use described. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.


The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.

This certificate describes that portion of water right Certificate 80060, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered JUN 03 2019, approving Transfer Application T-12896.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
