CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

E. E. GROUT
LA GRANDE, OREGON

confirms the right to use the waters of MILL CREEK, a tributary to the SNAKE RIVER for IRRIGATION of 112.0 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for UNION County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 8, at Page 1. The date of priority is 1869.

This Certificate together with Certificates 90393 and 94692, shall not exceed three acre feet per acre in any irrigation season, diverted at a rate of not to exceed one-fortieth of a cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent in case of rotation, in any combination between the sources measured at the point of diversion from the source(s).

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:



This certificate describes that portion of water right Certificate 6299, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered October 2, 1996, approving Transfer Application T-7351. This Certificate in combination with Certificates 90393 and 94692, supersedes Certificate 6299.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
