CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

CITY OF NEWBERG  
NEWBERG, OR 97132

confirms the right to use the waters of SKELTON SPRINGS, tributaries of CHEHALEM CREEK, a tributary of WILLAMETTE WATERSHED, for the purpose of MUNICIPAL, INCLUDING DOMESTIC, FIRE PROTECTION AND MANUFACTURING PURPOSES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-5977. The date of priority is JUNE 24, 1919. The amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 1.93 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND; the use hereunder for irrigation shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent in case of rotation.

A description of the lands irrigated under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where the water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

This certificate describes that portion of water right Certificate 5456, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered SEP 17 2019, approving Transfer Application T-12831.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use herein described.
