## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

C. TODD OGLETREE 6429 LAKESHORE DRIVE SELMA OR 97538

confirms the right to use the waters of DEER CREEK, a tributary of the ILLINOIS RIVER for IRRIGATION OF 6.7 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Josephine County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 13, at Page 70. The date of priority is MAY 15, 1886. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.13 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, IF AVAILABLE AT THE ORIGINAL POINT OF DIVERSION: SW1/4 NW1/4, SECTION 14, T38S, R7W, W.M.; HARMON DITCH – 1130 FEET NORTH AND 1150 FEET EAST FROM THE W1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 14.

The point of diversion located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-FIFTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre for each irrigated during the irrigation season FROM ARPIL 1 TO NOVEMBER 1 of each year.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

This is a final order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Prior to October 1, 2021, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

Prior to October 1, 2021, the water user shall install and maintain a fish screen or fish by-pass device, as appropriate, at the new point of diversion. The type and plans of the screen or by-pass device must be approved by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife prior to beginning of construction, and shall be installed under the supervision of the Department of Fish and Wildlife.

This certificate is issued to confirm an HISTORIC CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered \_\_\_\_\_\_, approving Transfer Application T-13046 and supersedes Certificate 57729, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose

is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
