confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit G-12431. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the well(s). The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: A WELL IN LOST RIVER BASIN
 PURPOSE OR USE: SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 125.8 ACRES
 MAXIMUM RATE: 1.36 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND
 PERIOD OF USE: APRIL 15 THROUGH OCTOBER 15
 DATE OF PRIORITY: MARCH 6, 1992

The well is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second(or its equivalent) and 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device approved by the Director in good working order, shall keep a complete record of the amount of water used each month, and shall submit a report which includes the recorded water use measurements to the Department annually by April 15 or more frequently as may be required by the Director. Further, the Director may require the water user to report general water-use information, including the place and nature of use of water under the right.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The well(s) shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works shall be equipped with a usable access port, and may also include an air line and pressure gauge adequate to determine the water level elevation in the well at all times.

The water user shall obtain a static water-level measurement for each well during March and October of each year and report the measurements to the Department. The measurement shall be made by a certified water rights examiner, registered geologist, licensed land surveyor or registered professional engineer, licensed water well constructors, licensed water well drillers or the water user/appropriators. Water levels shall be reported as depth-to-water below ground level in feet and inches or to one-hundredth of a foot and shall be accompanied by supporting calculations. The water user shall report the static water level(s) in the well(s) to the Groundwater/Hydrology Section of the Water Resources Department by April 15 and November 15, respectively, of each year.

If substantial interference with a senior surface or ground water right occurs due to withdrawal of water from any well(s) listed on this right, then use of water from such well(s) shall be discontinued or reduced or the schedule of withdrawal shall be regulated until the Department approves or implements an alternative administrative action to mitigate the interference.

This right is limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same lands.

The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years.

In the event that primary irrigation rights are not determined in the Klamath River Adjudication for lands identified as supplemental irrigation under the terms of this right, this right may be exercised as primary irrigation.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with any prior surface or ground water rights.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of appropriation, shall not exceed the quantity of water available from the original point of appropriation described as follows:

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change POINT OF APPROPRIATION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered JULY 13, 2018, at Special Order Volume 108, Page 840, approving Transfer Application 12826, and together with Certificate 93862, supersedes Certificate 93008, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
