CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

SHOTGUN RANCH LLC  
2730 NIGHTFALL  
BEND, OR 97701

confirms the right to use the waters of SHOTGUN CREEK, a tributary of CROOKED RIVER, for DOMESTIC USE.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Crook County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 1, at Page 449. The priority of the right dates from the year 1889 for the waters of SHOTGUN CREEK.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used from February 1<sup>st</sup> to December 1<sup>st</sup> of each year, and shall not exceed 0.005 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion on Shotgun Creek.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

17 S	20 E	WM	9	SE NW	SHOTGUN CREEK: 1940 FEET SOUTH AND 100 FEET WEST FROM THE N1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 9

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:



This certificate describes that portion of water right Certificate 89790, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered OCT 28 2019, approving Transfer Application T-12990.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
