CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit G-13255. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

PURPOSE OR USE: SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 141.4 ACRES AND SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION (TO BRING UP TO FULL RATE AND DUTY ONLY) OF 2.2 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 1.776 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND (CFS), BEING 1.767 CFS FOR SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 141.4 ACRES AND 0.009 CFS FOR SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION (TO BRING UP TO FULL RATE AND DUTY ONLY) OF 2.2 ACRES

PERIOD OF USE: WHEN NECESSARY FOR BENEFICIAL USE

DATE OF PRIORITY: JULY 26, 1996

The well is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the meter or other suitable measuring device approved by the Director in good working order, shall keep a complete record of the amount of water used each month, and shall submit a report which includes the recorded water use measurements to the Department annually or more frequently as may be required by the Director. Further, the Director may require the water user to report general water-use information, including the place and nature of use of water under the right.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device, provided however, where the meter measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

Groundwater production shall be from no shallower than 100 feet below land surface.

This right is limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land.

If substantial interference with a senior water right occurs due to withdrawal of water from any well listed on this right, then use of water from the well shall be discontinued or reduced and/or the schedule of withdrawal shall be regulated until or unless the Department approves or implements an alternative administrative action to mitigate the interference. The Department encourages junior and senior appropriators to jointly develop plans to mitigate interference.

Use of water under authority of this right may be regulated if analysis of data available after the right is issued discloses that the appropriation will measurably reduce the surface water flows necessary to maintain the free-flowing character of a scenic waterway in quantities necessary for recreation, fish and wildlife in effect as of the priority date of the right or as those quantities may be subsequently reduced.

In the event of a request for a change in point of appropriation, an additional point of appropriation or alteration of the appropriation facility associated with this authorized diversion, the quantity of water allowed herein, together with any other right, shall not exceed the capacity of the facility at the time of perfection of this right.

The well shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works shall be equipped with a useable access port, and may also include an air line and pressure gauge adequate to determine water level elevation in the wells at all times.

The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.


The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with any prior surface or ground water rights.

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 91415, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered DEC 05 2019, approving Transfer Application T-12591.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
