CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

W.W. HOWELL;  
ALBERTA KENDALL & LEE GULICK  
RICHLAND, OREGON

Confirms the right to use the waters of Powder River, a tributary of Snake River for the purposes of supplemental irrigation.

This right was perfected under Permit S-12423. The date of priority is October 29, 1936. The amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.11 cubic feet per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

Twp	Rng	Mer	Sec	Q-Q
9 S	45 E	WM	35	NE NW

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-fortieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

This certificate describes the portion of Certificate 14128 NOT modified by an order of the Water Resources Director recorded in Special Order Volume 51, Page 423 approving a partial cancellation. This certificate supersedes Certificate 14128.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
