Confirms the right to use the waters of Daly Creek, for the purposes of irrigation.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Baker County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 6, at page 440. The date of priority is 1862 for Tract No. 1 and 1882 for Tract No. 2.

The amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed one-twentieth of one cubic foot per second for each acre irrigated.
