CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

BCH CATTLE LLC 27542 INDIAN CREEK ROAD JOHN DAY, OR 97845

confirms the right to use the waters of INDIAN CREEK for IRRIGATION of 59.0 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Grant County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 15, at Page 461. The date of priority is 1878.

The amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 1/40 cubic foot per second per acre irrigated to June 1 and 1/80 cubic foot per second per acre thereafter; further limited to one acre-foot per calendar month to June 1 and four acre-feet per acre during season April 1 to September 30, measured at the point of diversion.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the old point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion.

When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

When required by the Department, the water user shall operate and maintain a headgate and measuring device, as needed. The water user shall report total flow figures when requested by the Watermaster. The Watermaster may operate the headgate and monitor the accuracy of the measuring device, as needed.

The water user shall maintain a fish screen or fish by-pass device.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

This certificate is issued to confirm changes in ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION and PLACE OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered JULY 2, 2002, at Special Order Volume 56, Page 614, approving Transfer Application 8772, supersedes Certificate 26029, State record of Water Right Certificates.
