CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

B. C. BOSTWICK
WILLIAMS, OR 97544

confirms the right to use the waters of FIDDLERS GULCH a tributary of APPLGATE RIVER for IRRIGATION of 1.8 ACRES and SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION of 13.2 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-3974. The date of priority is SEPTEMBER 10, 1918. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used, and shall not exceed 0.20 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND; The use hereunder for irrigation shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent in case of rotation.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:


This certificate describes that portion of water right Certificate 5357, State Record of Water Right Certificates, modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered APR 02 2020, approving Transfer Application T-12832.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

Rights to the use of water for power purposes are limited to a period of forty years from the date of priority of the right, as herein set forth, subject to a preference right of renewal under the laws existing at the date of the expiration of the right for power purposes, as hereby confirmed and limited.
