CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

MRS. J. B. WILLIAMSON
LOSTINE, OR 97857

confirms the right to use the waters of the SOUTH FORK OF WALLOWA RIVER, a tributary of WALLOWA RIVER for IRRIGATION of 0.6 ACRE OF LAND, DOMESTIC, and STOCK USE.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Wallowa County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 5, at Page 203. The date of priority is 1881.

The amount of water to which such right is entitle and hereby confirmed for the purposes aforesaid is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 1.5 acre feet per acre during any period of 30 days prior to July 31st of each year, and thereafter not to exceed 1.0 acre foot per acre during the entire remainder of the irrigation season; and said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contain in said decree.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:



This certificate describes that portion of water right Certificate 3188, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered FEB 24 2020, approving Transfer Application T-12904, approving a Historic Point of Diversion change.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
