Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The water user shall maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted.

60 days prior to using water each year, the water user shall provide to the Watermaster's office a map, drawn to OAR 690-015-0070 standards, showing which land will be receiving water for that current year. If a suitable map is not presented to the Watermaster's office 60 days before water use begins, the Watermaster may deny water to all lands involved in the transfer, or take appropriate enforcement action against illegal water use. Lands receiving water shall not exceed more than 365.15 acres in any year.

The water user shall implement and maintain a water use monitoring program approved by the Watermaster. Water use data shall be available to the Watermaster promptly on request. The water user shall provide an annual report of water use. Monitoring data shall be provided in an approved summary format by December 31 of each year.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in the decree.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in CHARACTER OF USE, PLACE OF USE, AND POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered December 22, 2003 at Special Order Volume 58, Page 448, approving Transfer Application 8604, and together with Certificate 80497, supercedes Certificate 4006, State record of Water Right Certificates.
