CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

70 RANCH INC.
22013 THOMAS CREEK RD
LAKEVIEW OR 97630

confirms the right to use the waters of NORTH FORK OF THOMAS CREEK for the purpose of IRRIGATION of 10 ACRES AND STOCK USE.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Lake County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the State Engineer in Volume 7, at Page 233. The date of priority is APRIL 21, 1871.

The amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed three-fourths acre foot per acre during any 30-day period prior to June 1st, and one-half acre foot per acre during any 30-day period after June 1st, of each year; and two and one-half acre feet per acre during any irrigation season; to be diverted under a head of not to exceed one-fortieth of a second foot per acre.

The point of diversion is located is as follows:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion described as follows:

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the weir, Parshall Flume, or submerged orifice, or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director in good working order at each point of diversion.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The water user shall maintain the headgate as required by the Department.

The water user shall maintain the fish screen at the new point of diversion consistent with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) operational and maintenance standards. If ODFW determines the screen is not functioning properly, and is unsuccessful in working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may request that OWRD regulate the use of water until OWRD receives notification from ODFW that the fish screen is functioning properly.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in the decree.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered OCTOBER 30, 2014, at Special Order Volume 93, Page 802, approving Transfer Application T-11748, supersedes Certificate 5220, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
