CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

STATE OF OREGON
WATER RESOURCES DEPARTMENT

confirms the right to use the waters of CAMP CREEK, tributary of the WEST FORK OF HOOD RIVER, for instream use for conservation, maintenance and enhancement of aquatic and fish life, wildlife, fish and wildlife habitat and other ecological values.

This right was perfected under Permit S-43314. The date of priority is February 10, 1978. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used, and shall not exceed 0.5 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The description of the stream reaches in which flows are to be maintained are as follows:

Reach 1:

From the authorized point of diversion for Camp Creek under Certificate 86804:

Reach 2:

Source: Camp Creek, tributary to West Fork Hood River

From the confluence of Camp Creek and the West Fork Hood River at approximately RM 6.0, in the NWNE of Section 28, Township 1 North, Range 9 East, W.M. at approximately Latitude: 45.5487398718, Longitude: -121.7003085908:

To the mouth of the West Fork of Hood River at River Mile 0.0 at its confluence with Hood River.

This is a final order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.


Within the specified stream reaches, the amount of water to which this right is entitled shall not exceed the quantity of water legally available at the original points of diversion. Stream channel losses and gains calculated based on available data and the use of water by senior appropriators will determine the amount of water to which this right is entitled downstream from the original point of diversion within the specified stream reach.

The instream right established by this allocation shall replace a portion of instream water rights established pursuant to ORS 537.341 or 537.346 and shall be in addition to instream water rights established pursuant to ORS 537.348 or 537.470, unless otherwise specified by a subsequent order establishing a new instream water right.

The right is subject to all other terms and conditions of Certificate 86804, and any related decree.

This certificate is issued to confirm an ALLOCATION OF CONSERVED WATER approved by an order of the Water Resources Director recorded in Special Order Volume 116, Page 100, approving Conserved Water Application CW-113, and together with Certificate 95150, supersedes Certificate 86804, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
