confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit G-9552. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the well(s). The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: A WELL, A TRIBUTARY OF FIFTEENMILE CREEK

PURPOSE OR USE: SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 232.2 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 1.6 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND (CFS)

DATE OF PRIORITY: NOVEMBER 13, 1980

The well is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, provided further than in the event of a request for change in point of appropriation, an additional point of appropriation or repair of this well, the quantity of water allowed herein together with rights perfected under Permits G-7869, G-8673, 44816 shall not exceed 2.6 cfs, the capacity of this system at the time of perfection of this right and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Water use measurement conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device approved by the Director at each new point of appropriation in good working order.
- B. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of appropriation shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of appropriation described as follows:

The right to the use of the water for the above purposes aforesaid is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
