CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

R.P. NEIL
ASHLAND, OREGON

confirms the right to use the waters of SPENCER CREEK and DEAD INDIAN CREEK for the purpose of IRRIGATION of 23.47 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for JACKSON County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 14, Page 498. The date of priority is 1858 for 16.51 ACRES and 1888 for 6.96 ACRES.

The amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.39 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), being 0.27 CFS for 16.51 acres and 0.12 CFS for 6.96 acres; measured at the head of the ditch or the point where the same leaves the natural stream, from April 1st to October 1st of each year.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:
