## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to use the waters of INDIAN CREEK for IRRIGATION of 108.6 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Grant County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 15, at Page 461. The date of priority is 1902 for TRACT #1, and 1905 for TRACT #2.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 1/40 cubic foot per second per acre irrigated to June 1 and 1/80 cubic foot per second per acre thereafter; further limited to one acre-foot per calendar month to June 1 and four acre-feet per acre during season April 1 to September 30, measured at the point of diversion.
