CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit S-19661. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the point(s) of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: NORTH UMPQUA RIVER, A TRIBUTARY TO THE UMPQUA RIVER

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION OF 0.64 ACRE

MAXIMUM RATE: 0.008 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), OR ITS EQUIVALENT IN CASE OF ROTATION, MEASURED AT THE POINTS OF DIVERSION, FURTHER LIMITED TO 0.004 CFS FROM EACH NEW POINT OF DIVERSION (POD)

DATE OF PRIORITY: MAY 10, 1950

The points of diversion are located as follows:

26 S	5 W	WM	30	NW NE	47	POD 4 – BLUM (NEW) - 3146 FEET SOUTH AND 3949 FEET EAST FROM W1/4 CORNER, SECTION 19

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, subject to the terms and conditions of that agreement between Elton V. Jackson and the California Oregon Power Company dated September 1, 1950. The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Water use measurement conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device approved by the Director at each new point of diversion in good working order.
- B. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring device are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The quantity of water diverted at the new points of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion described as follows:


The water user shall operate and maintain the fish screens at the new points of diversion consistent with Oregon Department Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) operational and maintenance standards. If ODFW determines the screen is not functioning properly, and is unsuccessful in working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may request the Oregon Water Resources Department (OWRD) regulate the use of water until OWRD receives notification from ODFW that the fish screen is functioning properly.

The water user shall maintain in-line flow restrictors at the new points of diversion that restrict water withdrawal to 0.004 cfs each.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm changes in POINTS OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered OCTOBER 7, 2016, at Special Order Volume 103, Page 69, approving Transfer Application T-12159, and together with Certificate 91903, supersedes Certificate 86120, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
