confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit G-8619. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the well(s). The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: THREE WELLS AND ONE SUMP WELL, TRIBUTARY TO COLUMBIA RIVER

PURPOSE OR USE: MUNICIPAL USES

MAXIMUM RATE AND VOLUME: 2.26 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND (CFS), BEING 1.84 CFS FROM SUMP WELL 1, 2.26 CFS FROM EB WELL 1, 1.78 CFS FROM EB WELL 2, AND 2.26 CFS FROM EB WELL 3, IN ANY COMBINATION BETWEEN THE SUMP AND WELLS; FURTHER LIMITED TO NOT TO EXCEED 1632.6 ACREFEET PER YEAR, OR ITS EQUIVALENT IN CASE OF ROTATION, MEASURED AT THE WELLS

DATE OF PRIORITY: JUNE 4, 1979

A description of the place of use is as follows:

THE PORT OF MORROW SERVICE AREA NEAR BOARDMAN, OREGON

Water use measurement conditions:

A. The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device approved by the Director at each (new and existing) points of appropriation in good working order.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

B. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring device are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The quantity of water diverted at the additional points of appropriation, together with that diverted at the original points of appropriation, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of appropriation as described as follows:

Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (water source) as the original points of appropriation.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described; however, water may be applied to lands which are not specifically described above, provided the holder of this right complies with ORS 540.510(3).

This certificate is issued to confirm ADDITIONAL POINTS OF APPROPRIATION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered NOVEMBER 3, 2017, at Special Order Volume 107, Page 89, approving Transfer Application T-12083, supersedes Certificate 90248, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
