CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to use the waters of SOUTH FORK JOHN DAY RIVER, for IRRIGATION of 17.7 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Grant County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 15, at Page 461. The date of priority is January 11, 1897.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

The amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed ONE-FORTIETH cubic foot per second per acre irrigated to June 1 and ONE-EIGHTIETH cubic foot per second per acre thereafter; further limited to 1.0 acre-foot per calendar month to June 1 and 4.0 acre-feet per acre during season April 1 to September 30, measured at point of diversion.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

The quantity of water diverted at the new additional point of diversion, together with that diverted at the original point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion.

Water use measurement conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meter or measuring device in good working order as approved by the Director, at the new point of diversion.
- B. If the existing open ditch diversions are utilized, the user must install a suitable weir, or flume and suitable headgate.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

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C. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the measuring device; provided however, where the measuring device are located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The water user shall maintain and operate the fish screen at the new point of diversion consistent with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's operational and maintenance standards.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in the decree.

This certificate is issued to confirm an ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered May 8, 2013, at Special Order Volume 89, Page 623, approving Transfer Application T-10939, supercedes Certificate 25496, State record of Water Right Certificates.
