confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit G-11242. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the well. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by a proper state officer.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meter or measuring devices in good working order, as approved by the Director, at each point of appropriation (new and existing).
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (water source) as the original point of appropriation.

The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years.

The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with any prior SURFACE OR GROUNDWATER rights of others.

The well shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

The right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF APPROPRIATION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered July 31, 2014, at Special Order Volume 92, Page 1112, approving Transfer Application T-11671, and together with Certificate 89368, supercedes Certificate 72361, State record of Water Right Certificates.
