confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit G-13492. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the well. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: A WELL IN THE WHYCHUS (FORMERLY KNOWN AS SQUAW) CREEK BASIN

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION OF 1.8 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 0.022 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND

DATE OF PRIORITY: MARCH 18, 1998

The well is located as follows:

14 S	10 E	WM	34	NW NW	WELL 2 (NEW) - 797 FEET SOUTH AND 282 FEET EAST FROM NW CORNER, SECTION 4

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of appropriation shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available from the original point of appropriation described as follows:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meter or measuring devices in good working order, as approved by the Director, at each new point of appropriation.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring devices; provided however, where the meter or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (water source) as the original point of appropriation.

The well shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon.

If substantial interference with a senior water right occurs due to withdrawal of water from any well listed on this right, then use of water from the well shall be discontinued or reduced and/or the schedule of withdrawal shall be regulated until or unless the Department approves or implements an alternative administrative action to mitigate the interference. The Department encourages junior and senior appropriators to jointly develop plans to mitigate interference.

Use of water under authority of this right may be regulated if analysis of data available after the right is issued discloses that the appropriation will measurably reduce the surface water flows necessary to maintain the free-flowing character of a scenic waterway in quantities necessary for recreation, fish and wildlife in effect as of the priority date of the right or as those quantities may be subsequently reduced.

The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

The right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF APPROPRIATION and PLACE OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered May 1, 2014 at Special Order Volume 92, Page 366, approving Transfer Application T-11520, and together with Certificate 89259, supercedes Certificate 85693, State record of Water Right Certificates.
