confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit S-17867. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: DEER CREEK, A TRIBUTARY OF ILLINOIS RIVER

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION OF 20.0 ACRES AND SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 147.3 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 3.35 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND

DATE OF PRIORITY: AUGUST 15, 1947

The point of diversion is located as follows:

38 S	8 W	WM	10	SE SW	830 FEET NORTH AND 1140 FEET WEST FROM S1/4 CORNER, SECTION 10

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-FIFTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated throughout the irrigation season from April 1st to November 1st of each year; provided further that the amount of water allowed herein, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall not exceed the limitations allowed herein, and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion described as follows:

38 S	8 W	WM	10	SE SW	360 FEET NORTH AND 650 FEET WEST FROM S1/4 CORNER, SECTION 10

Water use measurement conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meter or measuring device in good working order, at the new point of diversion.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.


The water user shall maintain a headgate to control and regulate the quantity of water diverted as required by the Department.

The water user shall maintain and operate fish screening and/or by-pass devices as required by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife to prevent fish from entering the diversion.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in PLACE OF USE AND POINT OF DIVISION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered April 8, 2010, at Special Order Volume 80, Page 581, approving Transfer Application T-10794, and together with Certificate 86183, supercedes Certificate 19720, State record of Water Right Certificates.
